Liberia's Struggle for Peace and Justice

Because the security of President Sirleaf and all attendees are the highest priority, attendees will be asked to undergo a security screening at the entrance to the International House auditorium. Doors open two hours prior to the lecture (5:00 PM). Please arrive early to give yourself enough time to go through security and assume your seat.

For security reasons, if you exit the facility during the lecture, you will not be allowed to re-enter.

Security procedures require that attendees go through a metal detector and some attendees may be subject to a wand search.

Small purses (8.5" x 11" x 4") will be allowed in the building, but they will be searched. The following items are prohibited:

- * Bags other than small purses
- * Backpacks of any size
- * Cameras — photography is not permitted
- * Umbrellas
- * External food or drink
- * Strollers. (No babes in arms - all guests must have a ticket.)
- * Mini-recorders
- * Signs, banners, flags or flag poles
- * Noise makers
- * Any items that can be perceived as a weapon

The organizers reserve the right to prohibit any item not explicitly mentioned in this list.

In order for all those who register to be admitted into the auditorium, please bring with you: 1) a print out of your registration confirmation and, 2) a valid form of Identification and be prepared to present both.
